Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Self-Assessment Examination (COMSAE) Phase 1 provides a tool for examinees to assess their strengths and weaknesses in scientific knowledge related to major medical problems. COMSAE is not developed to predict an examinee's performance on COMLEX.

This Performance Profile reports a numerical standard score for the total test and a graphic presentation for performance on content areas. The Total Score is a standard score. Its scale has a mean of 500 and a standard deviation of 80. Using COMLEX Level 1 examinee performance as the reference, a Total Score above 550 indicates a good performance or a good understanding of the major medical problem-related scientific knowledge. A score between 451 and 550 indicates an acceptable performance, a score between 350 and 450 indicates a borderline performance, and a score below 350 indicates a poor performance.

The graphic presentation provides performance information on content areas using the same four categories: Good Performance, Acceptable Performance, Borderline Performance, and Poor Performance. When using this Performance Profile to assess strengths and weaknesses, examinees must be aware that **the accuracy of performance categories on specific content areas is limited** since the number of items in each content area is relatively small.
