The COMLEX-USA examination series is the osteopathic assessment used for initial licensure of osteopathic physicians in the United States and internationally. In addition to providing the pathway to licensure for osteopathic medical practice, COMLEX-USA is a graduation requirement for earning a DO degree from a college of osteopathic medicine and is required for progression in graduate medical education.

A HISTORIC YEAR, WITH MANY ADVANCES AND CHANGES-THE WORD, FOUNDATION, SIGNIFIES OUR THEME FOR 2017 Message from Dana C. Shaffer, DO, Board Chair and John R. Gimpel, DO, MEd, President and CEO

The underlying foundational premise: assessment is important and valid, reliable, defensible assessment has a key role in protecting the public and affecting the quality of osteopathic medical education, training, and practice. The validity evidence supports this premise. The trust we've earned by the nation's state medical and osteopathic medical licensing boards, as well as the accreditation authorities for undergraduate medical education (Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation) and graduate medical education (Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education, American Osteopathic Association) solidifies the important primary and secondary uses of NBOME's assessments.

The infrastructure: quality assessment in undergraduate and graduate medical education helps to drive teaching and learning toward osteopathic medical care that impacts the health of patients and communities and further inspires lifelong learning and

continuous professional development. The foundation supporting the NBOME superstructure includes the collective talents, wisdom, strengths, and commitment of the NBOME 23 member Board of Directors, over 700 members of our credentialed National Faculty, and the more than 220 professional staff. Inspired by the NBOME mission and core values, the strength of our collective foundation to support quality patient care from DOs and related health care professions is solid and durable.

The NBOME's foundation is strengthened by collaboration and support from numerous partners and organizations, including the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA), the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) and its Assembly of Osteopathic Graduate Medical Educators (AOGME), the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical

Education (ACGME), the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) and the American Association of Osteopathic Examiners (AAOE). Contributions and input from representatives from other key stakeholder groups, including the Council of Osteopathic Student Government Presidents (COSGP), the Student Osteopathic Medical Association (SOMA), the AOA Bureau of Emerging Leaders (BEL), the Organization of Program Directors Associations (OPDA), and the member organizations of the Coalition for Physician Accountability (CPA)—all are essential to the structure, as are important connections with the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) and the National Residency Matching Program (NRMP).

COMLEX-USA, NBOME's core assessment program for osteopathic physician licensure, further solidified its foundation with the 2017 release of the enhanced COMLEX-USA Master Blueprint. The Master Examination Blueprint emphasizes the competencies required for generalist physicians to deliver safe and effective osteopathic medical care. The framework of COMLEX-USA is based on the foundation of the osteopathic approach to patient care. Its evidence-based design assures state licensing boards and the public that a DO has demonstrated minimal competence by passing a series of national standardized examinations designed for the practice of osteopathic medicine. COMLEX-USA test administration enhancements centered on improving the test experience and reducing anxieties for candidates, for example by building additional optional break times into the computer-based administrations for COMLEX-USA Levels 1, 2-CE, and 3 and providing additional tools, such as a computer mouse and clipboard, in the Level 2-PF clinical skills examinations. The enhancements to the attestation requirements for

COMLEX-USA candidate eligibility begin in 2018 with Level 3, and Levels 1 and 2 in 2019, and will include information from deans and residency program directors indicating that individuals are in good academic and professional standing. These requirements align with the public's need for entrustability. They serve to assure patients that those who are granted the privilege to be a physician and provide osteopathic medical care, have been assessed along the continuum for behaviors and milestones in knowledge and other competencies—including professionalism, with integrity and responsiveness to the needs of patients that supersedes self-interest.

Foundational to understanding the human condition in health and disease, osteopathic medical students learn and study core biomedical concepts in the first two years at US DO-granting medical schools, who requested national standardized assessments to align with teaching and learning similar to NBOME's COMAT clinical examinations for the clerkship/clinical rotation years. The COMAT program announced the 2018 release of a new portfolio of assessment services for undergraduate medical education, COMAT-Foundational Biomedical Sciences. In development for the past five years, the

comprehensive basic sciences examination will launch in late 2018, and targeted assessments geared for assessment by foundational science discipline or by organ body system are scheduled to be made available in late 2019.

Integral to our work are important collaborative assessment programs supporting testing for students, residents, pediatric dentists, cosmetic surgeons, podiatrists, osteopathic certification boards, practicing physicians and related health care professionals throughout their careers. This work has expanded internationally in recent years, with a number of consulting services provided to medical and related professional institutions around the globe. While the bulk of these collaborative initiatives have historically centered on traditional secure, proctored, summative multiple choice question examinations, or clinical skills/performance or oral practical examinations, there is a growing interest in assessment for learning, formative assessment, and longitudinal assessment with flexible delivery and immediate feedback for examinees.

NBOME's CATALYST platform launched in 2017 and is instrumental in several successful osteopathic board certification pilots demonstrating meaningful alternatives to the AOA's Osteopathic Continuous

Certification (OCC) requirements regarding recertification/continuous certification assessment. Initial results are promising, with practicing physicians reporting that CATALYST participation helps them take better care of their patients and is showing statistically significant correlation between CATALYST-delivered content and traditional recertification assessment formats. In 2018, NBOME's COMSAE self-assessment will launch via a CATALYST platform to provide an option for DO students looking for additional learning, practice and feedback regarding their proficiency in the application of osteopathic medical knowledge and other competencies in COMLEX-USA-like test item formats.

We continually measure ourselves and constantly endeavor to improve our assessments and services. We recognize that there is no "perfect test," but your feedback allows us to continue to strive for the best in providing valid, reliable and defensible assessments, and to attend to the test-taking experience. In the words of Confucius, "Humility is the solid foundation of all virtues," and we believe this value, held collectively by our dedicated volunteer and professional staff workforce, strengthens our foundation for a strong future in continuing to meet our mission.



NBOME PAYS TRIBUTE TO GARY L. SLICK, DO, MA

For more than five decades, Gary L. Slick, DO, MA, Immediate Past Chair of the NBOME Board, has devoted his time and wisdom to the NBOME. A leader of exceptional character and expertise, with a steadfast and fierce commitment to the NBOME's mission to protect the public, he served as Chair of the NBOME Board from 2015 to 2017. Dr. Slick is also the designated institutional official for graduate medical education programs at the Oklahoma State University (OSU) College of Osteopathic Medicine and OSU Medical Center in Tulsa, medical director and chief academic officer at Oklahoma's Teaching Health Center residency programs, and professor of medicine

at the OSU Center for Health Sciences (OSU-CHS), as well as a member of the board of directors of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).

At the NBOME Annual Board of Directors dinner on December 8, 2017, Dr. Slick was recognized for his devotion and lasting, immeasurable impact by Board Vice-Chair Dana C. Shaffer, DO. In his tribute, Dr. Shaffer thanked Dr. Slick for his selfless service to the NBOME and recognized the legacy of his leadership and clear vision for the future.

Since 1978, Dr. Slick has served as an item writer in physiology for the NBOME Part 1 examination,

COMLEX-USA Level 1, and in internal medicine for NBOME Part 2 and 3 examinations, and COMLEX-USA Levels 2-CE and 3. He was a member of the Test Construction Committee in interdisciplinary medicine and served with John E. Thornburg, DO, PhD as a final reviewer of COMLEX-USA Level 1 examinations for many years. Dr. Slick became a member of the NBOME Board in 2005 and was installed as Board Vice-Chair in 2013. Since that time, he chaired numerous committees, including the Liaison Committee, the COMAT Advisory Committee, the Nominating Committee, and the Standards & Assurances Committee.

THE SANTUCCI AWARD

The Santucci Award is bestowed on an individual for sustained outstanding contributions to the mission of the NBOME: protecting the public by providing the means to assess competencies for osteopathic medicine and related health care professions. The Santucci Award was established in 2009, named for Thomas F. Santucci, Jr., DO, president and chair of the NBOME Board from 1985 to 1987, in honor of his legacy. Dr. Santucci was the award's first recipient in recognition of his visionary efforts to advocate for competency-based assessment licensure by assessing basic scientific knowledge and its clinical application. His efforts helped the NBOME develop examinations to ensure the competency and quality of osteopathic medical practice.

WAYNE R. CARLSEN, DO, received the Santucci Award, the NBOME's highest honor, on December 8, 2017. With great appreciation, Gary L. Slick, DO, NBOME Board Chair, acknowledged and honored Dr. Carlsen for his long-standing history of contributions to the NBOME, its mission, and the profession at large.

Since 1989, when he became an item writer for the NBOME, Dr. Carlsen has served on a variety of exam construction and item review committees. In the late 1990s, he was the Level 3 Coordinator for COMLEX-USA and was a member of the Health Promotion, Disease Prevention/Health Care Delivery Examination Construction Committee. A member of the NBOME Board from 2005 to 2017, he served as chair of the board from 2013-2015, chair of the Compensation Subcommittee, and as a member of the Nominating Committee.

Dr. Carlsen is vice dean and associate professor in the Department of Family Medicine at the Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine (OU-HCOM), where he has been a faculty member since 1993. A practicing geriatrician in Ohio for over 20 years, Dr. Carlsen serves the health care needs of uninsured residents through OU-HCOM's community health programs. He is a graduate of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey School of Osteopathic Medicine, a fellow in the American College of Osteopathic Internists, the American Geriatrics Society, and the American College of Physicians.

THE NBOME CLARK AWARD FOR PATIENT ADVOCACY

Established by the NBOME in 2016, the Clark Award for Patient Advocacy recognizes individuals who have demonstrated an outstanding commitment to patient safety, patient protection, and quality of care. The award is named after long-time NBOME Board public member and leader in medical regulation and state medical licensure, Mr. Gary R. Clark.

MARTIN CRANE, MD, was honored with the NBOME Clark Award for Patient Advocacy on December 8, 2017. A board-certified obstetrician and gynecologist, Dr. Crane is a graduate of Princeton University and Harvard Medical School, as well as a commander in the Medical Corps of the U.S. Navy Reserves. He is past chair of the Board of Directors for the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), past chair of

the National Committee on Foreign Medical Education and Accreditation of the U.S. Department of Education, and former chair of the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine.

Dr. Crane has been involved in a wide array of quality assurance and improvement programs for more than 30 years and has spoken extensively on patient safety and adverse event reporting systems. The second recipient of the award for his lifelong advocacy for patient safety and physician quality initiatives, he is responsible for leading improved maintenance of physician licensure processes during his term as chair of the FSMB. Gary R. Clark, the award's namesake and its first recipient presented the award to Dr. Crane, recognizing him as a longstanding advocate for osteopathic medicine and the COMLEX-USA examination program.

The Frederick G. ENHANCING COMLEX-USA

The COMLEX-USA examination series is designed to assess osteopathic medical knowledge, fundamental clinical skills, and other foundational competencies considered essential for the practice of osteopathic medicine. The primary and intended purpose of COMLEX-USA is for licensure of osteopathic physicians, and COMLEX-USA is accepted for medical licensure in all US states and jurisdictions.

FOUNDATION FOR COMLEX-USA

RELEASE OF NEW COMLEX-USA MASTER BLUEPRINT

In July 2017, after more than nine years of extensive research, development, and review by stakeholders and expert reviewers, the new COMLEX-USA Master Blueprint was released. The master examination blueprint emphasizes the competencies required for generalist physicians to deliver safe and effective osteopathic medical care.

The framework of COMLEX-USA is based on the foundation of the osteopathic approach to patient care. Its evidence-based design assures state licensing boards and the public that a DO has demonstrated minimal competence by passing a series of national standardized examinations designed for the practice of osteopathic medicine. Aligned with the education and training pathway of a DO, passing Levels 1 and 2 of COMLEX-USA is also an accreditation standard for graduation with a DO degree and required for entry into residency training.

Prior to release of the new blueprint, Evidence-Based Redesign of the COMLEX-USA Licensure Examination Program, a manuscript published in the *Journal of the American Osteopathic Association* in April 2017, summarizing the evidence-based design processes that served as the foundation for blueprint development and the evidence supporting its validity, and providing an overview of the blueprint's two dimensions: Competency Domains and Clinical Presentations.

Featuring a framework that maps content to competency domains and clinical presentations, the new COMLEX-USA master examination blueprint and test specifications will be implemented in the Level 3 examination in September 2018. The new blueprint and test specifications for each exam will be introduced into Level 1, Level 2-PE, and Level 2-CE with the new test cycles beginning in 2019. Score reports will be revised to reflect the new master blueprint and test specifications.





CHANGES TO ELIGIBILITY

The NBOME's responsibility for professional self-regulation is shared with other authorities across the continuum in medical education, training, and licensure. In keeping with our mission, features to enhance protection for patients were added to the COMLEX-USA examination program in 2017.

In addition to existing requirements that candidates are only eligible to take the COMLEX-USA Level 1 examination after having successfully completed at least one full year at an AOA-COCA accredited college of osteopathic medicine (COM) and after attestation of good standing by the COM dean, the NBOME Board adopted new eligibility requirements for implementation in 2018-2019 which add the requirement for a dean's attestation of good academic and professional standing to the current eligibility requirements for Level 1. For Levels 2-CE and 2-PE, candidates must meet the expanded attestation requirement for good academic and professional standing, in addition to having passed Level 1 and completing at least two years at a COM.

Effective in September of 2018, DO residents are required to receive an attestation from their residency program directors in ACGME- and AOA-accredited GME programs that the resident is in good academic and professional standing in order to be eligible to take Level 3, in addition to existing requirements that a candidate must have earned a DO degree and passed Levels 1 and 2, in order to take Level 3. The NBOME recommends that Level 3 candidates complete a minimum of six months of residency training prior to taking Level 3. Beginning in 2018, score reports will be released to program directors who attest to the eligibility of a resident.

ENHANCING CANDIDATE EXPERIENCE

With the addition of a second National Center for Clinical Skills Testing (NCCST) in Chicago in August 2016 and the remodeling of the NCCST in Philadelphia in 2017, COMLEX-USA Level 2-PE candidates now appreciate the ability to choose to take their exams in either of two state-of-the-art test facilities.

Based on feedback from candidates, enhancements to COMLEX-USA computer-based exams and the clinical skills examination were implemented with the beginning of the new test cycles this year. A popular new enhancement allows optional 10-minute morning and afternoon breaks that do not count against allocated examination time. Other enhancements to COMLEX-USA Levels 1, 2-CE, and 3 include embedded lab value reference ranges and a standard online calculator feature. A computer mouse and clipboard were added to the Level 2-PE examination.

Initial feedback from candidates on the examination enhancements has been very positive, ranging from 81 to 91



Major progress toward a comprehensive upgrade to replace and update media used in examinations occurred in 2017. Over 4,000 images (e.g., photography, diagnostic imaging) in the item bank were reviewed for quality, precision and clarity of diagnosis. Recommendations were made for expanded multimedia use in future testing and investigations into further use of avatars and other advanced image types. Beginning in 2018, new standards for quality and clarity will be implemented for all media used in NBOME examinations.

NEW AND EXPANDED ASSESSMENTS

CATALYST FOR CHANGE

In response to changes in the environment and requests by certifying specialty boards to explore alternatives to traditional board recertification cognitive examinations, the NBOME partnered with several clients to pilot a new and innovative approach to competency assessment. CATALYST, the NBOME's flexible, innovative assessment-for-learning platform, supports continuous professional development via longitudinal assessment. In 2017, pilot tests with AOA Certification Boards, the American Osteopathic Board of Internal Medicine (AOBIM), the American Osteopathic Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (AOBOG) and the American Osteopathic Board of Pediatrics (AOBP) were conducted with board-certified osteopathic physician diplomates of the AOBIM, AOBOG and AOBP using the CATALYST platform. Initial results of the pilot studies are extremely positive with participating physician diplomates reporting that CATALYST would help them take better care of patients and is a preferred alternative to traditional recertification examinations. The CATALYST platform will be used with NBOME's COMSAE self-assessment program in early 2018.

Foundational Biomedical Sciences

FOUNDATIONAL BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE - COMAT

The Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Achievement Test (COMAT) program continues to grow each year. In addition to growth of the COMAT clinical examinations in 2017, introduction of the Foundational Biomedical Sciences (FBS) comprehensive examination was announced for availability in 2018. Requested by colleges of osteopathic medicine (COMs), COMAT FBS is designed to assess first- and second-year student progress in basic biomedical sciences. Examination content is organized by major organ body systems and biomedical science disciplines. After the first year, COMAT FBS targeted examinations by organ body system and biomedical science discipline are targeted for delivery in late 2019.

EXPANDING OUR FOUNDATION THROUGH RESEARCH

In 2017, the NBOME updated its research agenda to support the strategic plan, with an emphasis on collaborative research to support the validity of COMLEX-USA for its primary and secondary purposes, the validity of the COMAT clinical subject examinations for achievement in clinical disciplines, predictive validity studies to provide evidence for correlation of scores on COMLEX-USA and COMAT examinations, and resident in-service and board certification examinations. The research team continued research on the use of innovative item types and novel assessments. Additional research activities include collaborative research projects with partnering organizations and opportunities to improve the testing experience.

Activities included submitting to and publishing manuscripts in major medical journals; delivering presentations and displaying posters at conferences and key professional meetings; and conducting workshops and participating in symposia in the United States and abroad.

On October 17, 2017, the NBOME hosted a Research Advisory Forum in its Chicago Corporate Offices and Conference Center. The "Innovative Item Types and Assessments" conference brought together experts from numerous leading assessment organizations in the health professions for roundtable discussions and presentations on the development, practice, and implementation of innovative assessments for high-stake licensure and related testing. Automated item generation and the use of artificial intelligence in testing were among the presentation and discussion topics.

TOGETHER WE ARE STRONGER

A key strategic objective is connecting to the various members of the NBOME community—patients, state licensing boards, colleges of osteopathic medicine, graduate medical education programs, osteopathic medical students, resident physicians, practicing osteopathic physicians, specialty boards, and organizational stakeholders—to advance our mission by expanding our outreach, influence and effectiveness. As we approach 2020 and full implementation of the single accreditation system (SAS) for graduate medical education (GME), the need for continuous, clear and accurate communications is stronger than ever. NBOME advocates for the single accreditation system for graduate medical education, for COMLEX-USA and osteopathic medical assessment for DOs. In 2017, we hosted nearly 100 in-house meetings in our Chicago and Philadelphia offices, hosting thousands of attendees; visited 13 colleges of osteopathic medicine; participated in and presented to external organizations at more than 34

external meetings across the nation and internationally; and communicated daily and directly with thousands of individuals. In March, to spread the 2017 NRMP Match Day results, we launched a campaign, Perfectly Matched—engaging osteopathic medical students and residents to share their Match success stories with COMLEX-USA, the licensing examination designed to assess DO credentials for safe and effective osteopathic medical care. Throughout 2017, we promoted testimonials on social media to share the news within and outside the osteopathic medical profession.

Another big advancement in 2017 was the launch of a new website in August to improve the user experience of all stakeholders with improved interactivity and navigation, adaptive, responsive design, and optimized search capability. The new site features audience pages, enhanced access to NBOME research, news and announcements, account login functionality and more.











2017 NATIONAL FACULTY LEADERSHIP

The NBOME's National Faculty is critical to our mission of protecting the public through valid and reliable competency assessment for osteopathic medicine and related health care professions. Our diverse, dedicated Faculty includes nearly 800 professionals across the nation with expertise in osteopathic medical practice and medical education spanning the various disciplines and specialties, including a large number from full-time clinical practice and the physician licensure community.

To enhance the NBOME's position as the leader in osteopathically distinctive assessment, and

consistent with our strategic goal to increase our reach, influence and effectiveness in advancing the organization's mission to protect the public, in 2017 we expanded opportunities for resident and newly practicing physicians to serve on operational committees.

Of the nearly 100 National Faculty added in 2017, about 50 percent were in the "newly practicing physician" category of physicians in practice for 10 years or less. The National Faculty play an important role in the NBOME, with greater than 20 percent serving on operational and examination committees

and attending more than 96 meetings in 2017. NBOME worked with the American Osteopathic Association to provide 474 1-A and 5,725.75 1-B continuing medical education credits for 345 National Faculty in 2017 and sent recognition for scholarly activity to 75 organizations on behalf of 222 National Faculty members.

In August, the National Faculty Conclave met to recognize new and outgoing department and division chairs, update National Faculty Chairs about NBOME goals and product developments and receive input on new initiatives for 2018-2019.



The NBOME's COMLEX-USA, COMSAE and COMAT examination series form the center of our program activity. The series of COMLEX-USA examinations assess essential osteopathic medical knowledge and clinical skills for licensure and entrance into unsupervised practice as an osteopathic generalist physician. The COMSAE examinations are self-assessments of a candidate's knowledge and ability and correspond to COMLEX-USA Level 1, Level 2-CE, and Level 3. The COMAT program consists of eight subject examinations in core osteopathic medical disciplines to assess progress using a national-normed standard.









In 2017, the NBOME provided support for 40 examination programs for our testing partners and expanded test administration options for iPad delivery and score reporting. We continue to offer alternatives for

testing to new clients. In 2017, the NBOME entered into an agreement with the American Academy of Osteopathy to develop a new assessment, Core Osteopathic Recognition Readiness Examination (CORRE™), for physicians applying to ACGME-accredited residency programs with Osteopathic Recognition. CORRE will be delivered initially in 2018 and used by residency programs to evaluate physicians applying to their programs.


FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP




2017 REVENUE
